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

The program funds implementation research that is policy- and practice-relevant, and that examines the preparation, competency, compensation, well-being, and ongoing professional learning of the <u>early care and education (ECE) workforce</u>. All proposed research must have primary questions that are relevant to at least one of the Foundation's <u>three ECE</u> <u>workforce goals</u>.
